Rules of the climbing hall

March 2014

Welcome in the climbing hall T-Hall in Frankfurt. Climbing is risky, so you have to take reasonable precautions. Best you make a point of avoiding hazard in advance. If not following one or more of the house regulations, it may result in banning you from climbing or expelling you from the hall alltogether. In doing so you have no claim for refund of your entrance fee.

- Use of the climbing wall and boulder-area is at one's own risk.
- Parents are responsible for their children.
- Orders given by T-Hall staff have to be followed.
- · Everybody may climb.
- Belaying is strictly limited to persons who are competent in at least one relevant belaying technique and tying directly into the harness.
- Only persons who holds the certificate »KLEVER Klettertrainer« or »DAV Trainer C Sportklettern« are allowed to instruct beginners in belaying, after regestration.
- Belayers are obliged to check safety chain in complete, including climbers' harness and direct tying-in.
- The rope has to be tied directly into the climbers' harness.
- Soloing (climbing without rope) is only allowed in the bouldering-areas.
- Leading is only permitted for experienced climbers. The leading climber must use every quickdraw provided. If two parallel quickdraws are available, both have to be used. If the rope is used for top-rope climbing afterwards, the rope has to remain in at least two quickdraws.
- Use of chalk is only permitted if special chalk-balls are used.
- Altering or removing ropes, holds, quickdraws, ... is allowed T-Hall staff exclusively.
- Smoking is not allowed.
- Dogs and other animals are only allowed in the climbing hall with explicit T-Hall staff permission.
- Everybody in the climbing hall concurs with usage of photos for promotion by T-Hall (including on the internet).
- Claim for personal injury or damages is not possible.
